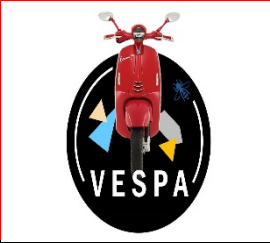

Student Destinations as it stands 18/19

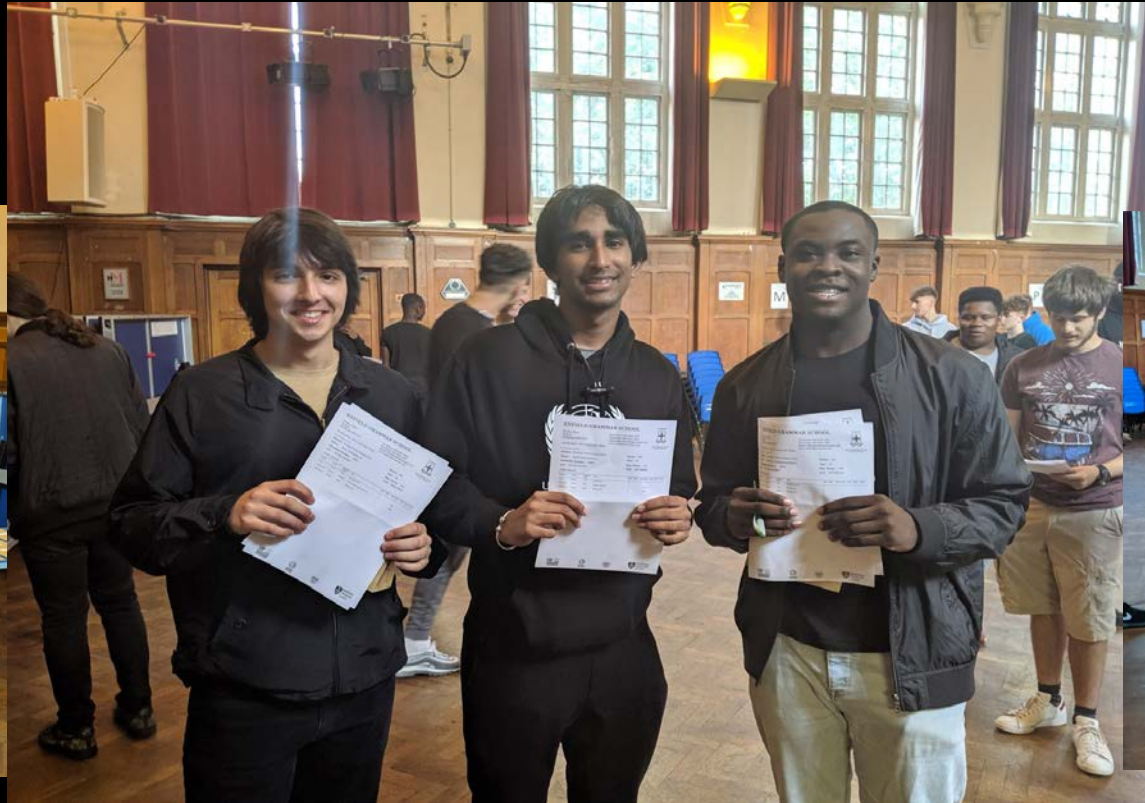
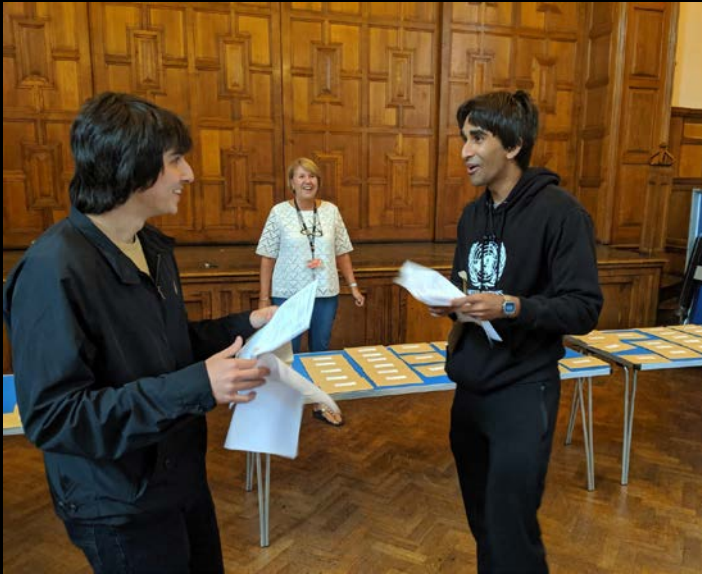

EGS Basics



- Tutor time is now held on a Monday and Thursday from 3.10-3.30pm. There is no morning registration.
- Period 1 starts at 8.45am
- All Sixth Form now have break at 9.45am until 10.05, P2 10.05-11.05 and P3 11.05-12.05
- Students now permitted to use the Sixth Form door at break 9.45-10.05 and lunch (12.05)
- Students are no longer required to attend progression on a Friday, time is allocated to UCAS/Apprenticeships and catch up sessions.

Attendance



- 96% is the minimum expected.
- 10% statistically is a whole grade.
- 10% over a year is a whole month off.
- This does and will effect final outcome.
- Single biggest difference that you can help with.
- Dentist, driving lessons should not be during lesson times.

Google Classroom



Ensure that you are signed into and checking the year 13 google classroom daily.



16-19 Bursaries



- Students will need their own bank account.
- Application forms are available on the website
- Dependent on family income – different levels of support.
- If child was free school meals they will be eligible.
- Payments to bank account of student.
- 96% required each week for payment to be made.
- If eligible we will back pay from September for weeks when payment due.
- Payments will be made every half term.
- Amount per student will depend on the number eligible.

APPLYING THROUGH UCAS

- In order to apply to Universities in the UK, you must apply through UCAS.
- **Students are permitted to apply to up to 5 Universities through UCAS.**
- They will need to check the entry requirements of the courses they apply for before submitting an application. For Russell Group Universities they will need a minimum prediction of 3 Bs.
- **Students are required to submit a personal statement and subject references along with their application.**
- When all personal details, GCSE grades, predicted grades and references have been completed students will need to pay (£24) and press send. The application is then submitted to Ms Igbokwe for verification and proof reading before then being sent.



APPLYING THROUGH UCAS

- Within a day or two of receiving students application, UCAS will send them an acknowledgement which they need to check carefully – let them know if there are any problems.
- At this stage, applications are made available for institutions to view online, however, they cannot view the other choices made. The institutions then make a decision on each application and whether or not they wish to invite you to attend an interview. They have three choices:
 1. **They can make an unconditional offer (i.e. they will give you a place irrespective of any future exam results)- Rare/problematic**
 2. **They can make a conditional offer (i.e. tell you what grades you need to achieve in your exams to be given a place)- Most Common**
 3. **They can reject your application.**

What should my son be doing outside the classroom?



- All sixth formers will have allocated Supervised Study sessions on their timetable. They should also be studying at home.
- The key to students academic success lies in efficient use of their free time.
 - Year 12 should be completing a minimum of 9 hours a week independent study
 - 1st term Year 13, aim for 12 hours independent study
 - In year 13, A/A* Students were doing up to 20 hours a week
 - A grade B at GCSE equates to a D at A Level without independent study and good attendance.





Independent study and Folders

Boys should be using this time to complete homework, independent study (additional reading, practice questions, PLCs etc), organisation of subject folders and preparation for assessments.



Independent Study Sheets - Be prepared by reading through your subject choices worksheets. You should be aiming for 9 hours a week independent study in the first term of year 12 (3 hours per subject). Remember that a 6 at GCSE equates to a E at A level. You have to put in the work!
