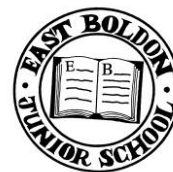

Child Safety Reminders:

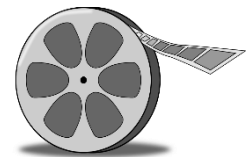
Parking
