A huge thank you to the PTA volunteers and staff that give up their time to make this event so much fun. We all had a great time!



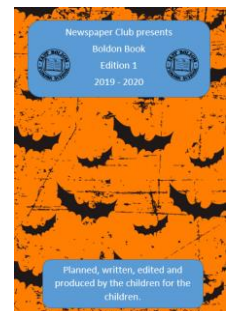
Parents' Evening

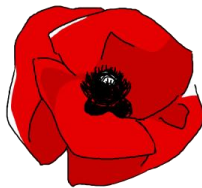


Y6 Summer School
