Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) 2016 - 2017

What is PPG

The pupil premium is allocated to local authorities and schools with pupils that are known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) as recorded on the January School Census. Funding is also available to children in care (who have been or were looked after continuously for at least six months) and to children whose parents are in the Armed Forces.

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The Department for Education urges schools and local authorities to encourage parents to register their child as eligible for FSM so that each school receives their maximum Pupil Premium entitlement.

Supporting positive behaviour

A representative team of staff from all departments will work together to revise documentation relating to behaviour management to ensure that all plans are clear, manageable and shared effectively with parents. As result children will be very clear on how to make progress themselves and parents can share strategies with staff to better support them at home when necessary. £10,000

Complex Learning Difficulties and Disabilities

Pupils who have complex learning needs will have access to intervention sessions that support aspects of personal development and breaks down barriers to learning. This will take the form of specific group and individual activities planned for their progress. £25,000

More able pupils

Pupils identified as more able from our school data will have access to a range of activities, workshops and offsite learning that challenge and inspire them. £7,470

Outdoor provision

Improvements will be made for further structured learning activities based around the school grounds. Activities will support core subjects as well as sports, play and horticulture. Residential activities for older students will be offered to allow access to Duke of Edinburgh Award programmes. £8000

The Senior Leadership Team maintains an overview of the provision for vulnerable pupils and of the progress they are making. The Head teacher feeds back to Governors.

The Head Teacher's Termly Report includes information on:

- The range of interventions used and the impact of those
- The cost effectiveness of the provision made ("value for money").
