Subject:	Frequency:	Type:	Suggested amount of time to be spent on homework:
Maths	Weekly	Homework will be a mixture of tasks but will often be set on the HegartyMaths website, which enables revision of prior topics to keep them fresh. There will be further practice on current topics or tasks related to the knowledge gaps highlighted by class tests. Students will also receive paper homework which may include problem solving activities or generating revision resources. At the end of each half term, students receive a booklet of exam papers to complete to the best of their ability, mark and then hand in after the half term break.	60-90 minutes per week
GCSE Physical Education	Weekly practical	Students must be playing one sport competitively for a team or club. Students should also be attending at least one, ideally two, other extra-curricular clubs to play recreationally and improve their scores in their second and third sport.	3-4 hours
	Weekly theory	Students should be spending at least 45-60 minutes each week on one of our online platforms - The Everlearner or Seneca Learning - to review their understanding of work that has been covered in class. Students will be set at least one piece of written home learning in each of the four weeks of study - this will equate to around two pieces per half-term. Set home learning will not always be marked by the teacher but will always be integral to either securing understanding of a prior learned topic or could inform upcoming areas of study.	60-90 minutes per week
Hospitality		Practising practical dishes. - Once dishes for Controlled Assessment have been selected students (Approx October) students are expected to practice these dishes at home, and/or afterschool with teacher support, to ensure they are experts in their dishes.	Practical cooking - 2 hours a week during Controlled assessment period (Oct - Feb)
		Revision - Students will be asked to revise specified topics. Revision guides will be available to buy to support this. Past papers will also be provided to support revision.	Revision - one hour a week.
Textiles	Ongoing	Students will be working on a range of tasks within their coursework and exam projects. These tasks will include presenting work, photography, drawing, artist research, sampling, annotating, and designing. A large part of the homework will be responding to feedback. Students will be provided with a help booklet for coursework projects to assist them with independent work.	
Construction	Weekly	Week 1 spelling test on show my homework of technical words week 2 define the week 1 words.	
MFL	Weekly	There will be vocabulary and grammar learning which is tested each week. Students will be expected to consolidate their learning in class by practicing a set of vocabulary or key sentences at home. Students will be able to practice using information from their book or Show my homework.	30 minutes/an hour per week
	Fortnightly/3 weekly	Student will be expected to extend their knowledge with vocab and grammar by using Vocab express and quizlet, they are programmes which enable students to learn and practice vocabulary. Teacher will set up home work from these Student will have reading and listening homework to do at least once a term and they will have to mark it themselves. Students will feedback their result as well as WWW and EBI Students will have to revise at home for their assessments at the end of each term.	
Dance	Ongoing	Students will be working on their dance practicals - will have to give up rehearsals for an hour a week to get them completed and improved. Will also need to plan what will be done in rehearsals in preparation.	1 - 2 hours.

Dance	Ongoing	Students will be working on their dance practicals - will have to give up rehearsals for an hour a week to get them completed and improved. Students will also need to plan what will be done in rehearsals in order to prepare.	1 - 2 hours

English	Weekly	Students are expected to develop their knowledge and understanding of all GCSE literature texts. There will be a range of activities designed to deepen their understanding of the writer's craft and effects created. These activities will include revision tasks and exam based questions. Additionally, students will complete activities designed to embed the skills required for their GCSE language exam. These activities will include writing tasks, with a focus on technical accuracy, and reading and developing inference skills through a range of fiction and non-fiction texts.	60-90 minutes
Science		Students will be expected to complete their daily Tassomai activities a minimum of 4 out of 7 times a week. Students will also be set a mixture of additional homework tasks that may include exam practice, completion of practical write-ups, test revision and other exam preparation activities deemed appropriate by their teachers.	60-90 minutes
